













Gaza children do not access 90% of their normal water use (UNICEF)



Barely a drop of safe water to drink: Less then a 1 liter per day per person






#### Damaged agricultural land in the Gaza Strip, October 2023 – January 2024





#### Projected Acute Food Insecurity | 16 March - 15 Ju




Figure 20: Acute malnutrition drivers. Source: Global Nutrition Cluster



# Starvation is a Weapon of War, but where is Impunity?

## Crime of Starvation: Rome Statute (ICC)

• Art. 8 (2)(b)(xxv): <u>Intentionally</u> using starvation of civilians as a method of warfare by <u>depriving them of objects indispensable to their survival</u>, including <u>willfully impeding relief supplies</u> as provided for under the Geneva Convention.
